At the start of the month, our PTA hosted a coffee morning in aid of Macmillan Cancer Support and raised £66.66 and a second-hand uniform sale that raised £168.85. We also invited our students to raise money by wearing jeans into school for the day; thanks to so many of our students getting involved, they raised a whopping £308.11 for the Jeans for Genes charity.

Community-wise, our Open Mornings for families to come and visit the school have also started in the last month and we have been welcoming many of you into our school with the reception picnic and Rock the Tots hosting a 'Stay 'n' Play' session (both pictured below). Their music, storytelling and bubbles were the perfect antidote to any lockdown blues our visitors may have been feeling! More music news has come in the form of Bristol Beacon nominating our school to become a Music Mark School in recognition of our commitment to providing high-quality music education for all our pupils. We are also proud to have supported some of our pupils through completion of the Bikeability Level 2 Cycle Training. Perhaps our most surprising and heart-warming event within our school community this last month though, was when our year 6 pupils planned a surprise party one lunchtime to thank the school staff that work with them, and show just how much they are appreciated. We are delighted with the hard work and kindness that is persistently shown by our pupils.



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Finally: challenges. Despite starting the year with a major electrical fault and alongside a busy term, we have continued our drive to encourage a love for reading for all of our children. We started the month with our celebrations of Black History Month with Ms Spence gifting her Year 6 reading group each their own copy of Marcus Rashford's book, 'You Are A Champion'. Despite the challenge for a Liverpool FC fan to willingly read the book of a footballing rival, they overcame it! The School Leadership Team have unanimously joined the UKLA Teacher Reading Group as well, further marking our dedication to reading for pleasure. Pupils in KS2 have also joined in with Bristol Waste's #WasteNothing Schools' Challenge to help reduce waste and make Bristol an even better place to live, whilst continuing our school's commitment to sustainability.

As the autumn draws in, we are looking forward to even more community building, overcoming exciting challenges, and supporting charities!





GREAT NORTH RUN - 12 SEP 2021

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
LETTINGS
